Objective

Innovative audit model WoG approach, multi stakeholder engagement, focus on inclusiveness

73 SAIs and one sub national audit office conduct **performance audit of preparedness for the first time.** 222 SAI staff trained. **Guidance on auditing preparedness** (Arabic, French, English, Spanish).

Audits as per performance audit standards. Quality assurance provisions,

Advocacy & Awareness of SAI role through SAI Leaders and Stakeholders discussions at UNDESA-IDI meetings, regional meetings and webinars

Focus on **strategic involvement** in implementation of SDGs.

Urged national governments into action, where there wasn't any Provided independent oversight on the implementation of the 2030 agenda in the national context

Numerous recommendations for enhancing preparedness and implementation Raised awareness amongst citizens and stakeholders on the significance of implementing 2030 Agenda.

Parliaments and other actors initiated actions leveraging on SAI reports

Audit of strong & resilient national public health systems (linked to SDG 3.d)



Include public health in disaster management governance structures and policies Establish or strengthen of existing coordination structures horizontally and vertically for public health risk management

Ensure essential public health functions during emergencies

Focus on preparedness for future events

Include civil society organisations in policy development to a larger extent

Include focus on those left behind/vulnerable groups specifically in health policies and plans

Cover gaps in capacities that constitute a resilient national public health system Update preparedness plans and strengthen focus on risk management



Audit of strong & resilient national public health systems (linked to SDG 3.d)

Promote the social and economic development of small and medium-sized enterprises A system of recognition to promote equity, inclusion and empowerment of vulnerable populations A SPP professionalization strategy for officials in charge of public contracting and state suppliers

National purchasing law to include criteria of environmental sustainability and inclusion of the vulnerable population,

Develop an action plan that allows for increased communication and coordination with local governments

Coordination between sectors involved in SPPs, through inter-institutional agreements

Audit of Sustainable Public Procurement (linked to SDG 12.7) for 14 SAIs in OLACEFS

Public procurement body to analyze the applicability of regional good practices on SPP related to vulnerable sectors
